

## New Hall students raise over £400 for hospital breast unit

On Wednesday 16 January, students at New Hall School, Boreham, raised over £400 for the Princess Alexandra Hospital Breast Unit with a cake sale. Each Year 7 tutor group baked and bought an array of cakes to be sold at break and lunch time. It was a lively event with students and staff across the school immersed in fundraising for the treatment of those with breast cancer. Year 7 stalls sold charity bracelets alongside their cakes to raise awareness and created motivational posters to support this charitable cause. Raffle tickets were sold for large cake donations, charity gift sets and a deluxe box of chocolates.

Due to the overwhelmingly generous supply of cakes, the school were able to donate a selection to CHESS Homeless in Chelmsford and Colchester Homeless Shelter. The Cake Sale was a spectacular event that would not have been possible without the enthusiasm of each Year 7 tutor group, their tutors and parents.
