81% of grades A*/A for 21 New Hall 11-year-olds

The record GCSE results include 81% of grades at A*/A for twenty-one New Hall Preparatory Division 11-year olds, who achieved a Level 1 GCSE in their Politics Foundation Project Qualifications.

Year 6 pupils Louise Adiukwu, Maximilian Pietrzak, Alice Rushton and Joseph Sidwell all produced exceptional projects, achieving over 90%. Mr Moulton, Head of Preparatory Division, said: "Our pupils should be very proud for achieving such outstanding results in a GCSE project 5 years early. We are delighted to be able to offer this unique course, which offers our pupils exposure to the world of politics and current affairs early in their school career."

Outstanding achievers across the Preparatory and Senior divisions include many boarding students.
